Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- June 18 is set to be a crucial day for Thailand's political landscape with 3+1 significant issues scheduled to be examined by the Constitutional Court and the Office of the Attorney General (OAG).



- ❖ The 1st issue is Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin’s allegations of ethical misconduct after 40 former senators have asked the court to rule on his decision to appoint Pichit Chuenban as Minister's Office Minister.

- ❖ The 2nd is Move Forward Party’s potential dissolution. The Election Commission (EC) has requested the court to dissolve the party due to its attempt to amend the lese-majeste law, which was seen as an effort to overthrow the constitutional monarchy. The court has ordered the EC to provide more evidence by June 17, a day before the next deliberation on June 18. If dissolved, executive members of the Move Forward Party could face a 10-year political ban.

- ❖ The 3rd is the Constitutional Court will also rule on the Senate election rules. Senatorial candidates have petitioned for a ruling on the constitutionality of 4 provisions in the Senate election’s organic law, including candidate introduction and selection process rules. If found unconstitutional, the Senate election results could become null.

- ❖ The 4th is the summoning of Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra’s lese-majeste case by the OAG. The OAG has summoned Thaksin for indictment on June 18 regarding royal defamation charges from his 2015 comments about the privy council’s role in the 2014 coup against his sister Yingluck Shinawatra. Thaksin will seek bail on the same day.
- Yutthaphon Isarachai, a political science professor at Sukhothai Thammathirat University, commented on the potential political turmoil that could happen on June 18, which has led many to speculate that the military might stage a coup.
 - ❖ He acknowledges that under Thailand's current fragile democratic system, a coup is always a possibility. However, he believed that a traditional military coup is

unlikely to happen at this time. Instead, he stated that a coup could take place in a more subtle form.

- ❖ Yuthaporn also believed that the Move Forward Party is at high risk of being dissolved. If this happens, and Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin is forced to resign, a new prime minister will need to be elected and a new government formed. This could lead to a shift in political power.



- Former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, who is on home detention, attended a birthday party in Nonthaburi yesterday. The celebration was for Nonthaburi mayor Somnuk Thanadechakul's 79th birthday.
 - ❖ Thaksin vowed to reclaim all the 8 MP seats in Nonthaburi in the next general election, similar to when the now-dissolved Thai Rak Thai did. All 8 MP seats were secured by the Move Forward Party in the previous election in May 2023.
 - ❖ Thaksin also said the country is in a fragile state after 2 coups, mismanagement by the junta governments, and the COVID-19 pandemic, but the Pheu Thai-led government is trying its best to revive it.



- Paetongtarn Shinawatra, leader of the Pheu Thai Party, attended a press conference for the upcoming "Love Pride Parade 2024" yesterday. When questioned by journalists about her father's upcoming appearance at the Office of the Attorney-General on June 18, she declined to comment.

- ❖ Later, in a Facebook post, Paetongtarn clarified that the reason she attended the press conference was mainly due to her role as a party leader and head of the Soft Power committee who is responsible for promoting events. She expressed her desire to avoid being repeatedly asked political questions at these events in the future.
- ❖ Paetongtarn also suggested that inquiries regarding governmental matters be directed to the Prime Minister or the Cabinet. For matters concerning her father, she said that journalists could contact him directly.



- The Facebook page "Ee-So Ka-Yee Kao 3 (อีซอชัยข้าว3)" posted a picture of an expense statement for military new recruits of Batch 1/67 with the caption "New recruits complain that their salaries are less than 5,000 Baht after various deductions, including 500 Baht per person for septic tank cleaning."

- ❖ Later, the page posted that the unit commander had ordered the cancellation of the 500 Baht septic tank cleaning fee, citing a "misunderstanding." Previously, new recruits had a total of 6,280 Baht deducted from their salaries, leaving them with only 4,710 Baht. As a result of the cancellation of the septic tank cleaning fee, new recruits will now receive 6,170 Baht.
- ❖ Suthin Khlangsaeng, Minister of Defense, will hold a press conference to clarify this issue today at 10:30 AM.

- National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) Prachuap Khiri Khan Office has released the results of its investigation into Suthin Chidchob, who served as the warden of Prachuap Khiri Khan Prison from July 2014 to September 2015.
 - ❖ The investigation found that Suthin ordered the establishment of a women's prison club to produce goods for sale at the prison's welfare shop. However, this order was not supported by any law and the profits from the sales were not deducted and given to the prison welfare shop.
 - ❖ Based on these findings, the NACC has concluded that Suthin's actions constitute a criminal offense of abuse of power. The NACC will send the relevant documents and evidence to the Ministry of Justice for disciplinary action against Suthin and his associates.



Economic News

- Bank of Thailand's Monetary Policy Committee voted 6-1 to maintain the policy interest rate at 2.5%, as the market had expected. The current policy interest rate supports growth and inflation outlook while ensuring long-term macro-financial stability.
 - ❖ MPC secretary Piti Disyatat said the committee decided to maintain its policy rate in light of Thailand's economic growth prospects. The growth was driven by domestic demand and the tourism sector, despite weakness in exports. Some export goods are facing increased pressure from heightened competition.
 - ❖ The Thai economy is projected to grow by 2.6% in 2024 and 3% in 2025, driven by strong domestic demand, tourism recovery, and increased government spending. Exports are expected to grow slowly due to structural challenges and reduced competitiveness, with pressures from weak foreign demand, especially in the automotive sector.
 - ❖ Headline inflation is forecasted at 0.6% for 2024 and 1.3% for 2025, with core inflation at 0.5% and 0.9%, respectively. Inflation is rising as diesel subsidies and

excess raw food supplies phase out. Headline inflation is expected to reach the target range by Q4 2024.



- Prime Minister Srettha insisted he is unaware of the plan to replace chairman of the board of the Bank of Thailand (BoT), Porametee Vimolsiri, whose term is due to expire. He said he would need to consult with Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavanajira, as there has been no discussion on the matter so far.
 - ❖ Addressing rumors that Kittiratt Na-Ranong, an advisor to the prime minister, would be appointed to the position, Srettha said it was not possible. He explained that he had retweeted a message before stating that Kittiratt would need to resign from his advisory position for one year before taking on the role of BoT board chairman.
 - ❖ Regarding the BoT's decision not to reduce interest rates, Srettha affirmed that the government is still implementing various economic stimulus measures while adhering to the law and prioritizing the well-being of the people. He emphasized that if one approach fails, he will try alternative strategies.
- The World Bank has downgraded Thailand's GDP growth forecast for 2024 to 2.4%, from 2.8% in April and 3.2% earlier this year. The 2025 forecast is also reduced to 2.8%, down from 3% in April.
 - ❖ Growth in the East Asia and Pacific (EAP) region is projected to decline to 4.8% this year due to a slowdown in China, despite faster growth in other large economies. The region's growth is expected to further soften to 4.2% in 2025 and 4.1% in 2026. Compared to January, EAP growth is anticipated to be 0.3% higher in 2024 and 0.2% lower in 2025.
 - ❖ China's growth is forecasted to slow to 4.8% in 2024, 0.3% higher than January forecasts, due to strong early-year activity. Consumption is expected to slow amid weak consumer confidence.
 - ❖ In the EAP region excluding China, growth is projected to pick up to 4.6% this year, driven by global goods trade benefiting exports and industrial activity. This

growth is expected to be strongest in export-oriented economies like Thailand and Vietnam. The tourism recovery will also boost service exports in countries like Cambodia and Thailand. Growth is expected to increase to 4.7% in 2025 and 4.8% in 2026 as global trade stabilizes.

- A survey by "Khao Hoon Online" on global stock market trends since the beginning of 2024 found that the Thai stock market has underperformed all 11 other markets in the Asia Pacific region.

❖ The Stock Exchange of Thailand has fallen by 7.07%, while the Shenzhen Stock Exchange has fallen by 6.77%. The only market in the region to have risen significantly is the Ho Chi Minh Stock Exchange, which has gained 13.76%.

❖ Several negative factors have contributed to the sharp decline in the Thai stock market index. These include factors such as the ongoing war in the Middle East, the direction of Fed interest rates, and domestic political factors.

- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,316.69 points, up 0.59 points (+0.04%). Trading value was 46.526 billion Baht. The market rebounded in the short term and closed slightly in positive territory, supported by buying in DELTA shares. However, the overall market remains volatile even though the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) kept the interest rate at 2.50% as expected and is highly likely to maintain the rate in the near future.
- ❖ Meanwhile, domestic political pressures have eased after the Constitutional Court has yet to rule on the dissolution of the Move Forward Party and the prime minister's case. However, these cases remain issues to be monitored until a court decision is made. The Constitutional Court has summoned additional witnesses in both cases and scheduled the next hearing for June 18 for both cases simultaneously.

- Seven bidders for the rice in the rice-pledging scheme have qualified for the bidding, while one bidder failed to qualify, Deputy Prime Minister and Commerce Minister Phumtham Wechayachai said.
 - ❖ When asked if he still expects the 15,000 tonnes of rice from the 2013-2014 harvesting season to be sold at 15 Baht per kilogram, Phumtham refused to comment but said that he believed in the quality of the rice.
- The Supreme Administrative Court upheld the Central Administrative Court's decision to dismiss a case against a committee overseeing the bidding for the construction of the Orange Line's western extension between the Thailand Cultural Centre and Bang Khun Non.
 - ❖ The plaintiff, Bangkok Mass Transit System (BTSC), accused members of the committee of unfairness. This accusation stemmed from the Mass Rapid Transit Authority of Thailand's (MRTA) decision to scrap the initial tender for the project and call for a new round of bidding with new criteria after BTSC had already submitted its bid. The contract later went to Bangkok Expressway and Metro (BEM).

- ❖ The court stated that they dismissed the case because the MRTA and the committee had followed regulations in the bidding process. The verdict means that the contract with BEM can now be signed.
 - The price of fresh chicken has increased significantly. Over the past 2-weeks, the wholesale price has risen by 31 Baht per kilogram, from the original price of 55 Baht to the current price of 81 Baht.
 - ❖ Additionally, the price is gradually increasing by 1 Baht per kilogram on a daily basis. As a result, the retail price has climbed to 95-100 Baht per kilogram, despite the fact that the market for fresh chicken is very quiet.

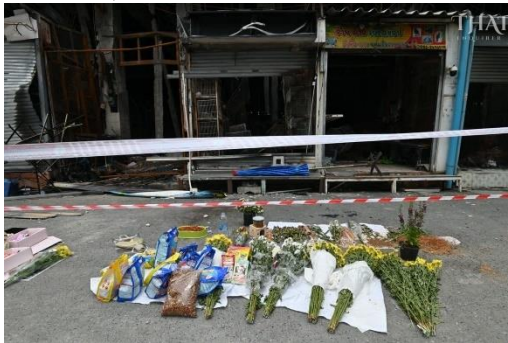

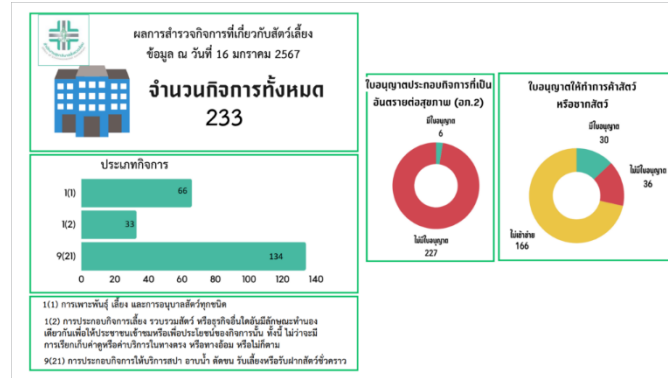
- The STRONG Association Against Corruption said the Waree Phirom Sports Center spent 495,000 Baht to purchase 15 fiberglass water bicycles shaped like ducks, at 33,000 Baht each.
 - ❖ The association noted that the market price for these water bicycles is typically around 20,000-22,000 Baht.
 - ❖ The sports center, operated by the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration, is already involved in the investigation for potential corruption related to the purchase of exercise equipment at inflated prices.



- Bangkok Governor Chadchart Sittipunt announced that the fire at the Chatuchak Market, which is located on State Railway of Thailand (SRT) land, damaged 118 shops and killed around 5,000 animals.



- ❖ According to the relevant laws, Chadchart stated that the Department of Health has clearly stated that animal breeding, trading, pet cafes, and pet spas are businesses that pose a health hazard. Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) is responsible for issuing licenses for these businesses. Therefore, by July 15, 2024, all such businesses must register with the BMA and enter the system, Chadchart said.
- ❖ In addition, the SRT must apply for a permit to re-open the damaged zone, and each shop must apply for a permit with the BMA. To obtain the permit, businesses must provide a good living environment for animals. The BMA will also expand its efforts to 2 other major pet trading locations in Bangkok, including Thonburi Market (Sanam Luang 2) in Thawivatthana district and Chatuchak 2 Minburi Market in Minburi district.
- ❖ A recent survey found that there are a total of 233 businesses related to pets, mainly dogs and cats, in Bangkok. Only 6 of these businesses have applied for a proper license. 227 businesses do not have a license, and only 30 businesses have applied for a license to trade in animals. In the future, all businesses will be required to apply for both types of licenses, Chadchart said.
