Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- Pheu Thai party, the ruling leader of the coalition partner, has won the Pathum Thani Provincial Administrative Organization (PAO) by a mere 1,969 votes, a win that would push the party to look at the way it is going forward.
 - ❖ Pathum Thani's incoming PAO president Chan Puangpetch, backed by the ruling Pheu Thai Party, secured 203,010 votes and won the seat by around 1,969 votes against Pol Lt Gen Kamronwit Toopkrajang, who received 201,041 votes.
 - ❖ Chan, who was the PAO prior to this election but his win margin at such low margin despite having former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, his son Pantongtae and

his daughter – Paetongtarn Shinawatra, having campaigned or promoted him should be a wake up call for Pheu Thai party.

- ❖ Pol Lt Gen Kamronwit stated that he will not defy the results and admitted defeat. When asked about his opinion on former Prime Minister Thaksin’s help in securing votes for Chan, Pol Lt Gen Kamronwit did not answer but said he will stop engaging in politics after this.



- Move Forward party’s advisory chief, Pita Limjaroenrat, accused the Election Commission (EC) of practicing double standards by fast-tracking its case for the party’s dissolution to the Constitutional Court, without giving the party a chance to defend itself.



- ❖ The main opposition party has been fighting to avoid being dissolved, and its executive committee being debarred from politics for 10 years by the charter court, for allegedly attempting to topple the constitutional monarchy through its election campaign promise to amend the country’s lèse majesté law.

- ❖ Pita said that the EC’s petition to the charter court is illegal, because its central allegation is based on the court’s ruling 3/2567, dated January 31, which is a separate case. He cited the charter court’s ruling in 2010, which dismissed the EC’s call for the dissolution of the Democrat party, claiming that the EC had bypassed some procedures. The EC petitioned the court, seeking the party’s dissolution, without allowing it to defend itself and, therefore, its petition is invalid.
- ❖ The party has rebutted the EC’s decision to proceed to the charter court by, among other things, challenging the authority of the EC to do so and the severity of the proposed penalties vis-a-vis its alleged offences. The court is scheduled to hear the case on July 3 and July 9.

- Thailand's Parliament is set to convene its first regular session of 2024 on Thursday, July 4, following a royal proclamation by His Majesty the King. Wan Muhamad Noor Matha, Speaker of the House of Representatives, will be issuing summoning letters to MPs on July 3.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, the Senate is currently awaiting the official announcement from the Election Commission (EC) to certify the list of newly elected senators. This announcement is expected on July 3.
 - ❖ Once confirmed, senators are expected to begin reporting for duty on July 4. The new Senate's first meeting is then scheduled for the second week of July, likely between July 8 and 12. During this period, the Senate will also elect its Speaker and Deputy Speaker.
- Rumors emerged that senators associated with the Bhumjai Thai Party were told to refrain from media interviews. Instead, they will soon meet to discuss the selection of the Senate Speaker.
 - ❖ Currently, Gen Kriangkrai Srirak, a former commander of the Fourth Army Region and former advisor to the Ministry of Interior, remains a prominent candidate.

- ❖ Regarding the 2 Deputy Speaker positions, reports indicate that candidates with political experience and previous parliamentary service, including former MPs such as Sorachat Wichaya Suwanphrom of Nong Bua Lamphu and possibly Boonsong Noisophon, former EC judge, are being considered.



- Jaturun Boonbencharat, former Secretary-General of the Clean Politic Group and a contender in the Senate election, announced that he will seek a Supreme Administrative Court ruling to delay the EC's announcement of the newly selected senators today.
 - ❖ Jaturun accused that the recent Senate election may have been manipulated by political parties and breached Article 74 of the constitution.



- NIDA Poll said the survey from June 14 to 18 among 2,000 respondents at least 18 years old, from around the country. The respondents were asked to pick a politician they wanted to become the prime minister now. Up to 45.5% picked Pita Limjaroenrat, who comfortably beat Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin, whose popular rating dropped from 17.17% in the previous survey to 12.85%.
 - ❖ In the first popularity ratings survey by NIDA Poll from March 11 to 13, Pita had enjoyed 42.75% approval.
 - ❖ The popularity of Move Forward also rose from 48.45% in the first survey to 49.2% in the second survey while the Pheu Thai's dropped from 22.1% to 16.85%.
 - ❖ The top 5 PM's choice of the survey respondents:

- Pita 45.5%
- No satisfactory choice 20.55%
- Srettha 12.85%
- Pirapan Salirathavibhaga 6.85%
- Paetongtarn Shinawatra 4.85%

❖ The top 5 parties the respondents said they would vote for now:

- Move Forward 49.2%
- Pheu Thai 16.85%
- No satisfactory choice 15%
- Ruam Thai Sang Chart 7.55%
- Democrat Party 3.75%



❖ The data above shows that the popularity of Pheu Thai party is on the decline with Move Forward party's popularity on the rise.

- Polls done by NIDA in 2023 showed popularity of Move Forward at 44.05% and one released yesterday showed that its popularity is up to 49.20%
- Pheu Thai party's popularity in 2023 polls was 24.05% and latest data is 16.05%
- As for the Prime Minister candidate
 - Pita was at 39.40% in 2023 and now at 45.50%
 - Srettha was at 18.60% in 2023 and now at 20.55%



- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin said the United States ambassador wrote to him to propose that the Thai air force buy F-16 Block 70 fighter jets, but said many points had yet to be discussed - including his requirement for the United States' reciprocal and equal investment in Thailand.
 - ❖ The prime minister said the US ambassador, Robert Godec, wrote to him to ask the air force to purchase F-16 Block 70 fighter jets from the US company Lockheed Martin. He had discussed the air force's project to buy new fighter jets with air force chief ACM Panpakdee Patanakul on several occasions because it had used F-16 Block 35 jets for a long time.
 - ❖ He told the air force commander to base the fighter jet selection on the 10-year air force development plan and on his 'offset policy' which meant that the supplier would have to invest in Thailand the same amount as the purchase price.



Economic News

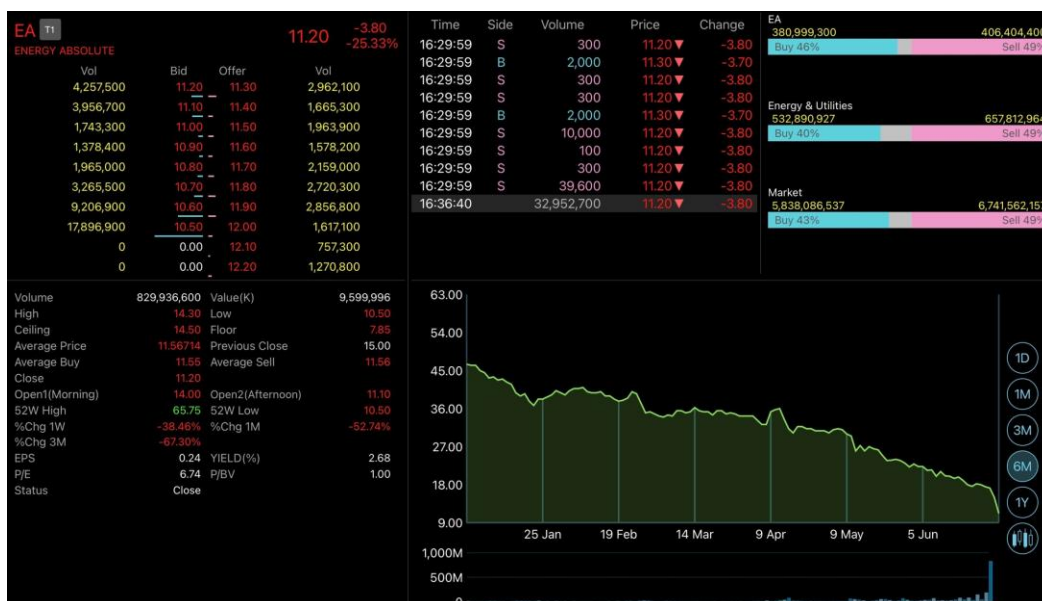
- Today, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior Anutin Charnvirakul will preside over a meeting with provincial governors and private sector representatives from Nakhon Ratchasima, Chaiyaphum, Buriram, and Surin provinces to consider proposed investment projects totalling 8.891 billion Baht in the Lower Northeastern regions.
 - ❖ After the meeting, the projects will be presented at the mobile Cabinet meeting in Nakhon Ratchasima on July 2. Key projects slated for completion within one year, with a combined budget of 49.99 million Baht, include initiatives to enhance tourism, develop the future food industry and bioeconomy, and address poverty. Additionally, the Alliance of Development has proposed 10 projects with a total budget of 8.841 billion Baht.



- Kasikornbank on June 29 announced a one-time cost of living allowance of 10,000 Baht for employees below 'Assistant Vice President' positions, which will be handed out in July 2024.
 - ❖ The bank also improved housing loan benefits by offering higher loan amounts and lower interest rates. For loans between 1-1.5 million Baht, the MLR interest rate is 5.50%. Loans from 1.5 to 3 million Baht will have an MLR interest rate of 3.75%, with an additional 1% reduction for those who install a solar cell rooftop system (3KW or more).
 - ❖ Loans exceeding 3 million Baht will have an MLR interest rate of 2.00%, with the same additional 1% reduction for installing a solar cell rooftop. These benefits will take effect on September 1, 2024. Moreover, Kasikornbank has extended its loan program to help employees manage personal debts. The loan amount will be based on the employee's actual debt burden, capped at 300,000 Baht, with an interest rate of 4% per year and a repayment period not exceeding four years.



- Energy Absolute Plc (EA) CEO Somphote Ahunai will hold a press conference today to clarify rumors and the company's 2nd half of the year business plan.
 - ❖ On June 28, EA shares closed at 11.20 Baht, down 3.80 Baht or 25.33%, with a trading value of over 9.599 billion Baht.
 - ❖ Nex Point Plc (NEX) shares closed at 1.68 Baht, down 0.18 Baht or 9.68%, with a trading value of 521 million Baht.
 - This followed rumors that customers were delaying orders for EV buses from NEX, EA's main dealer, which could affect second-quarter 2024 earnings.
 - ❖ There are also concerns about the rollover of EA's bonds, which are due soon. Investors noted that EA shares that have been shorted as of June 27th, were over 113 million shares, putting pressure on the share price. This suggested that some major shareholders are lending EA shares to certain investor groups for short selling.



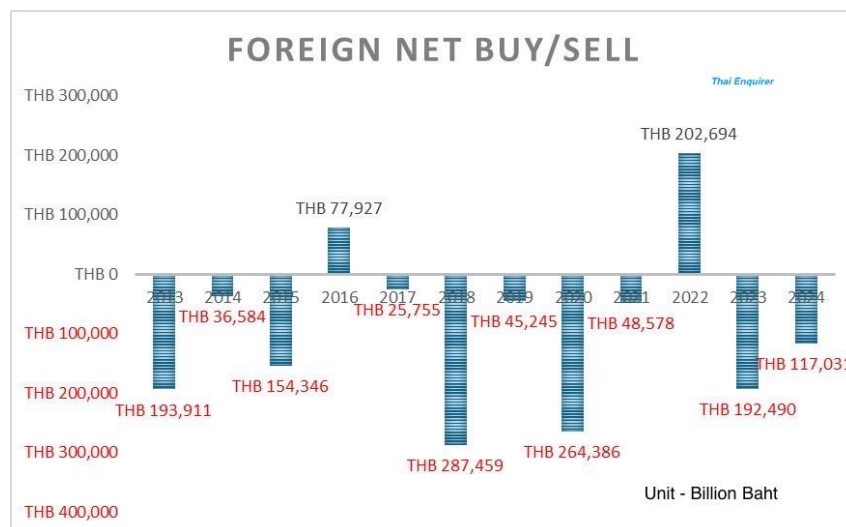
- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) has dropped by 8.11% so far this year as the 1st half of the year trading ended on Friday.

- ❖ Trading volumes have dropped and so has the listing of new shares (IPO), amid gloomy sentiments on the equity markets.



- ❖ Foreign investors have continued to dump Thai shares and in the 1st six months of this year have sold a net of 117 billion Baht of Thai stocks. Total net selling has been more than 1 TRILLION Baht in the past 10-years.

- Charoenrath Vilailuck, Chairman and CEO of Samart Corporation Plc (SAMART), has informed the Stock Exchange of Thailand about a court ruling requiring the company to pay 718 million Baht to the Bangkok Asian Games Organizing Committee (BAGOC).
 - ❖ This sum includes a principal debt of 190 million Baht and interest of 528 million Baht, related to financial support SAMART provided for installing a telecommunications network for the 13th Asian Games held in 1998.
 - ❖ The company had encountered financial difficulties due to the economic downturn that year and sought to cancel the agreement. However, BAGOC did not consent, leading to the lawsuit.
 - ❖ SAMART is negotiating a seven-year installment plan for the interest payments and assures that this settlement will not impact its financial stability.

General News

- At least one person was killed and a number of others were wounded when a car bomb was detonated in front of police apartments in Bannang Sata district of Thailand's southern province of Yala yesterday.
 - ❖ According to an initial police report, southern insurgents parked a car, rigged with explosives, near the front of the police apartment building, which is just a short distance from the district office and police station. Several other cars were also parked in front of the building. It is not yet known whether the device was triggered by a timer or by remote control.
 - ❖ The force of the explosion extensively damaged the apartment building and a number of other cars in the area. Fire trucks rushed to the scene to fight the ensuing fire, while security forces cordoned off the area around the apartments. In the aftermath of the blast, the forward command of the Internal Security Operations Command (ISOC) has ordered security at all government buildings in the province to be stepped up.



- Phuket experienced severe flooding yesterday due to continuous heavy rainfall and runoff from the mountains, marking the worst flooding in a decade. The torrential downpour also rendered many roads impassable.
 - ❖ Despite Phuket International Airport itself remaining unflooded, 17 flights were diverted as the adverse weather conditions severely limited visibility for landing. Flights were redirected to alternative airports such as Surat Thani, Langkawi, Krabi, Penang, Suvarnabhumi, and Don Mueang.
 - ❖ According to Prime Minister Srettha, the flooding situation is now easing, with only the Thalang district still experiencing lingering floods. Today, Phuket will undertake a big-cleaning operation to clean up the debris caused by the floods.

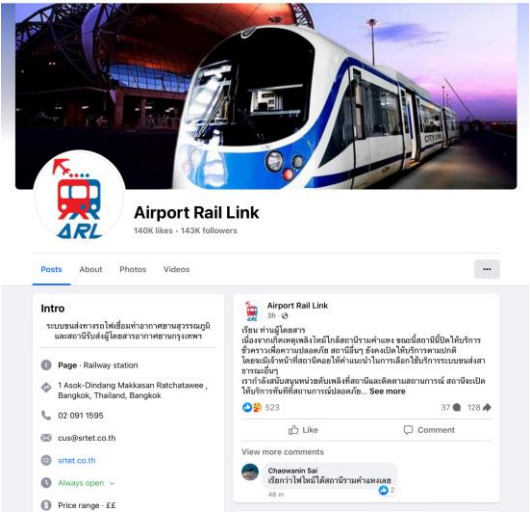
